Werner Schwark, owner of Isettas-R-Us, explains: "More

often I'm hearing from Isetta enthusiasts about getting a pattern and correct scale drawing made for the deluxe and non-deluxe Interior panels which often are not correct in scale and therefore could have some issues fitting these panel to the car".

"Our embroidery firm has a large computerized digitizing system which is capable designing large patterns therefore we went ahead and took original unharmed interior panels and digitized the outline and holes to be cut with the Zeus laser cutter. The parcel shelf and the deluxe front door panel designed for the vent grilles were carefully taken apart to be able to digitize the individual shapes involved".
